TIPS FOR FAMILY:

Reading

Find ways to read, write, and tell stories. You can create a book together or make up stories. Reread favorite books because rereading helps the students read with fluency and accuracy.

Math

Be positive about Math. Math builds confidence and opens the door to a range of career options. Make math a game. Play Go Fish, Uno, Trouble, or complete a puzzle; this will focus on following directions, logic, reasoning, sorting, and counting.

BASIC SKILLS FOCUS



1st/2nd GRADES:

Reading: Phonemic awareness (rhyming, substituting beginning and ending sounds in words, CVC words, consonant digraphs (sh, ch, wh, th, ck); glued sounds (-all, -an, -am), Suffixes (s, es, ing), blends (with s, l, r), VCe rule

Math: Solve problems with adding and subtracting, place values (ones, tens, hundreds), counting sequence, counting money, telling time, measure in standard units, shapes and their attributes, and interpreting data

3rd/4th GRADES:

Reading: Comprehension strategies: Cause/Effect, Fact/Opinion, Opinion Writing, Parts of an Essay, Sequence, Plot, Characterization; Figurative Language (simile & metaphor); Fluency; Text Features

Math: Multiplication, Rounding, Place Value up to the Ten Thousands, Adding and Subtracting of Whole Numbers, Understanding Whole Numbers, Comparing Whole Numbers (<, >, =), Adding and Subtracting Three digit Numbers, Using Place Value, Order, and Grouping to Multiply
